Minutes

Featured Speaker:

North Kitsap Legacy Partnership: Kitsap County Commissioner Steve Bauer and Olympic Property Group President Jon Rose
North Kitsap Legacy Partnership: A Vision for Conservation and Economic Development for North Kitsap County.
Commissioner Bauer and Mr. Rose outlined their visions and plans for a cooperative partnership for land use in North Kitsap County. Olympic Property Group owns

approximately 8000 acres of land in North Kitsap. The proposal is for the county and OPG to work together to keep 7000 acres of open space and concentrate development around Port Gamble. By concentrating development, you get a model community: Port Gamble: compact (efficient public service delivery), self supporting (daily goods and services), model of innovation and sustainability. This sense of partnership, urgency, and legacy between private sector, environmental organizations, local state and federal governments & tribes will be unprecedented in Kitsap County.

Commissioner Bauer and Mr. Rose went into some detail regarding specifics and answered questions from KCAC members.

County report:

An event coming up: March 30: 6:30-8:30 at PG Pavilion. County staff will be there. It is a meeting on rural policy initiatives in a public meeting open house. There will be remarks by commissioners and tables.

Pete Sullivan discussed that LAMIRDs (Local Areas of More Intense Rural Development) are a focus for Kitsap County DCD. He is interested in working with KCAC on those areas that are near Kingston. He is hopeful some of this work will go before the Planning Commission at the end of the summer.

The KCAC expressed frustration in the lack of content in county quarterly reports. The committee is about a two way communication between the county and the community. It is not known where to get this information, even if it's on the web. The KCAC needs this information to be able to advise the community. Pete Sullivan will try to come up with a better report or way to get information to the KCAC.
