1. YMCA Green Stormwater Infrastructure Tour Silverdale YMCA; 3909 NW Randall Way <i>The YMCA has pervious pavement, pervious paver paths and nine rain gardens. See these facilities and find out how much water the pervious concrete can soak up – with a live demonstration.</i>	1:00 – 1:45
2. Travel to Creekside	1:45 – 1:55
3. Creekside Project Tour 9633 Levin Road (office park near Clear Creek Interpretive Center) <i>Rain garden and commercial parking lot. This rain garden can improve water quality by collecting runoff from a parking lot and treating it before it flows to Clear Creek. This is a great demonstration of a commercial business working to help our environment.</i>	1:55 – 2:20
4. Travel to Brookwood	2:20 – 2:30
5. Brookwood Green Street Tour NW Brookwood Lane <i>Brookwood Lane is Kitsap County's first Green Street. In September, ten rain gardens were built in the road right-of-way in this neighborhood.</i>	2:30 – 3:00
6. Travel to Scandia Valley for Ritscher project	3:00 – 3:20
7. Ritscher Fish Barrier Removal and Restoration Project 16436 Thorpe Rd. NE, Poulsbo <i>This is one of the first projects funded with a Backyard Habitat Grant. The Ritscher's obtained a Backyard Habitat Grant to remove an old concrete structure in a stream channel that impeded fish passage.</i>	3:20 – 3:40
